# Greenway & Trail Users Advisory Group (GTUAG) Meeting Notes Tuesday, May 8, 2012 - 7:00 PM GF Park District, 1210 7<sup>th</sup> Avenue South, Grand Forks, ND

#### I. Previous discussion items:

- a. Status of the supplement to the original Greenway Plan: Status of the supplement to the original Greenway Plan: The final plan has been completed and is ready for distribution. It will be available on the Greenway website soon.
- b. Disc golf course at Riverside Park: The first mowing was done this week. The cleanup project was to remove weeds, tall grass, woody flood debris, and a few stumps in preparation for the course. There were no live trees removed from the site. The removal of the burdock will help with the cross country skiing routes through this area.

Two local birders contacted Kim to ask what was happening and why was it necessary. One bird watcher was concerned that migratory or environmental impact studies were not done before the mowing. These studies were not done because the site was being restored to pre-flood conditions and the migratory bird act is for the protection of sales and export of migratory birds. Kim will meet with Dave Lambeth, representative for the local birding group, and discuss the overall greenway plan to discuss how bird habitat fits into the continuing development of the Greenway. This has been done in the past with other user groups such as snowmobilers, dog owners, etc.


c. Bike rental racks: The survey results were shared with the committee. Bike rentals have been discussed for many years but so far there have been no rentals available at the Greenway. UND Wellness Center contacted Kim about a year and a half ago and expressed interest in bike rental racks on campus. The GGF Convention and Visitors Bureau is also interested in having bike rental racks around the community. The group decided to conduct an online public survey to gauge interest in this type of service. The survey generated three hundred and fourteen responses.

UND tried a green bike program on campus but it wasn't successful because users had no financial ties to the bike. Many of the bikes were damaged or lost and the project was abandoned. A bike rental rack program makes users financially responsible for damages or loss of a bike. The racks work similar to renting a stroller at the shopping mall; a person swipes their credit or prepaid membership card and removes the bike from the rack. The bike can be returned to the same rack or left at another rack. A software chip in the bike tracks when the bike is put into use and returned to the rack.

Kim will be contacting private businesses about their interest in providing bike rentals along the Greenway. This could be either with a staffed facility or a rental rack system. The City could be involved in the project by pursuing outside funding to purchase the racks. Most private enterprises are not eligible for federal funding through transportation grants. The program would be administered through a private company. The Dial-a-Ride program is an example of a federally funded program that is administrated by a private vendor. The city would also be involved with the placement of the racks on city owned property. There are also sponsorship opportunities through the Livability Grant, Blue Cross Blue Shield, or other transportation or health related industries.

I was also just in Austin, TX, the bike riding capital of the U.S. There are bike share racks all throughout the entire city. They are also a university town, with students riding bikes all over. UND students would love a bike share program, I know, I work there. Grand Forks is so unbelievably behind the times it's embarrassing.
