

PLANTING A TREE IN FOUR EASY STEPS

Step 1: Contact an authorized greenway representative

Step 2: Select a location. Staff will be happy to work with you to find the perfect spot for your tree.

Step 3: Purchase a tree: Several local nurseries are available to assist with finding the perfect tree from the Approved Greenway Tree List. Donors are responsible for all fees associated with the purchase of the tree. The Approved Greenway Tree List can be found on the back of this brochure.

Step 4: Pat yourself on the back for contributing a gift that will keep on giving for generations.

FAQ

May I transplant a tree from a private property? This may be allowed if the tree stock meets the standards of the American Association of Nurserymen Standards.

Who will care for the tree or shrub after it is planted? Once planted and established by the donor, the tree or shrub becomes the property and responsibility of either the City of Grand Forks or East Grand Forks, depending on location.

What if the tree becomes diseased or dies? Dead or diseased trees will be removed and may not be replaced if deemed appropriate by the Greenway Staff.

Will I be able to have a plaque noting the donation near the tree? No. Plaque or other type of recognition cannot be placed near the donated tree. Greenway Staff may use other means of recognition through social media and other public announcements, as deemed appropriate.
