Special Project Request Updates -

River Access Master Plan – Update:

- Tim Williamson:
 - Water should be thought of as another trail.
 - Water trail access is usually every 8-12 river miles but in city limits, access should be measured as "time on the water."

New Business

Special Project Requests:

• Temporary Art Display Request – Nicole Derenne:

- "Crossing the Border" is created by Guillermo Guardia, professional ceramic artist.
- "Crossing the Border" will include 300 small ceramic figurines. The figurines range in size from 3" to 8" high, and are painted a variety of bright colors in weatherproof ceramic glaze. The figurines resemble boys and girls running. They are lacking in individualized facial features. The figurines will be set as if they were running to the river and from the river to the other side.
- "Crossing the Border" represents stories of immigration from people of various cultures, backgrounds, and nationalities. Included in the installation are some clay coyotes, will symbolically try to stop the figurines.
- The project is facilitated by the Public Arts Commission, and is funded by a grant from the Community Foundation of Grand Forks, East Grand Forks and Region. Other partners involved in planning for this installation include the City of Grand Forks Planning and Community Development office.
- The installation requires about 100 feet on either side of the Sorlie Bridge, from the bank of the river to the paved path on the Greenway. The installation will utilize the Greenway in GF and EGF.
- "Crossing the Border" will be installed on June 18, 2016 to be ready for public viewing by noon. The art will be de-installed at 5:00pm the same day.
- The public can walk/mingle amongst the figurines.
- ◆ A sign would be present to explain the meaning to the public.
- Stephanie Erickson motioned for approval. Seconded by Dave Kuharenko. All in favor by stating "I". No opposed. Motion approved.

Brief summary of request:			
We respectfully request permission to install a public art project on the bank of the Red River flanking the Sorlie Bridge in downtown Grand Forks. The installation, called "Crossing the Border", will include 300 small ceramic figurines, anchored in the ground by one small wooden skewer per figurine. The figurines range in size from 3 inches to 8 eight inches high, and are painted a variety of bright colors in weather-proof ceramic glaze. The forms of each figurine are simplified to geometric shapes, to be recognizable as human figures but lacking individualized facial features, the figures resemble little kids, girls and boys running. The figurines will be set as if they were running to the river and from the river to the other side. "Crossing the Border" represents stories of immigration from people of various cultures, backgrounds, and nationalities. Included in the installation are some clay coyotes, will symbolically try to stop the figures. "Crossing the Border" will be installed on Saturday, June 18, on view from noon – 5:00 p.m. It is our hope that installing the work on the opening of the Farmer's Market and the Art & Wine Walk season, and in conjunction with other events taking place on the Greenway, will draw additional people to the downtown area and increase participation in viewing the work.

The total cost of the project is \$8,000.

The project is fully funded by the Community Foundation of Grand Forks, East Grand Forks and Region through a Forkin' It Over for Public Art grant, received in December 2015.

Does this project require ongoing maintenance? If so, who will maintain the facility?

No. "Crossing the Border" will be installed on June 18, 2016, to be ready for public viewing by noon, and will be de-installed at 5:00 p.m. on the same day.

Will this event or facility be open to the public?

Yes. Viewers are encouraged to view the installation either from a distance or close-up by walking among the figurines.

Does this activity or facility involve the use of harmful chemicals, excavation or fire? If so, please describe.

No. The anchors for each figurine are narrow wooden skewers, which are interred perpendicular to the ground.
