Old Business

a. Cross country ski & snowmobile routes in Grand Forks: The signs have been installed along the route. If there are problems with snowmobiles in unauthorized areas they should be reported to the police department for action.

II. New Business

- a. Project request forms
 - i. Lions request for temporary storage: The Lions' Clubs would like to install a temporary storage building at the Lincoln Drive Park boat ramp to store ten or twelve displays used for Christmas in the Park. This storage unit would be at the site year round but could be moved if needed during high water events. The displays are currently being stored at a remote site and are getting damaged during transport and the storage space is also getting too small for their needs.

The covenants on some of the properties in Lincoln Drive Park do not allow for the construction of permanent structures. GF Park District requested a permanent structure near that same area but the request was denied by the North Dakota Department of Emergency Services office. The committee is concerned about the aesthetics of a temporary trailer in the park, the intent of the Greenway for recreation and a floodplain and the potential for more requests for similar facilities.

The Park District is willing to work with the Lions' to find a space to store a pull behind trailer off site when Christmas in the Park is not in operation. The pump station at the park entrance may also be an option. Melanie will look into this. Mike will talk to the Lions' about a trailer on wheels to store at Lincoln Park golf course.

Solar lighting at 7th Avenue north – This was an idea that came out of the north end neighborhood meetings and charettes. The Near Northside Neighborhood (NNN) group has some dollars available to try addressing concerns about safety. They would like to consider solar lighting in the Greenway as a way to address this concern. The NNN are asking for the consideration of installing two lights at the 7th Avenue North entrance, with a match from the city, as a pilot project. There is also an interest for lights at the 2nd Avenue North entrance. This project would have to be taken to the Public Service Safety Committee for approval.

Lighting was included in the original plan but was dropped in Grand Forks. East Grand Forks has a few solar lights on the path along the Red Lake River and on Louis Murray Bridge for the boat ramp. Kim will contact EGF and light

- manufacturers for more details about how well they work in our climate and product costs. Lonny brought information on self contained solar lights that he found on the internet
- ii. Boat dock request: GF City staff met to discuss the possibility of purchasing and installing a boat dock this summer. It was decided to pursue funding for a dock through the North Dakota Game & Fish Department. The funding requires a 25% match from the local community. This will be an informational item at the January 5 Public Service Safety Committee meeting. Melanie is working on a letter of application for the deadline of January 1.
- iii. Disc golf tee pads and expansion: Kim has sent a letter to the applicant informing him that the request for expansion has been denied based on the potential for a small dog park on the site and a concern that disc golf dominates the recreation in the park.
- b. Pursuit of 502 (c) status: The committee would like to be able to accept funds from outside sources like grants and donatins but most times these grants require 501 (c) 3 status with the Internal Revenue Service. It was hoped that the Friends of the Greenway could serve as a conduit for funds or they could transfer their non-profit status to the Greenway Technical Committee but the Friends are in the process of disbanding and are not interested in transferring their status. Kim will begin the process of pursuing a non-profit status for the Greenway Technical Committee. The filing fees will be paid for either through the Greenway promotions fund. If the funds in the account insufficient the City of GF will find a way to fund the process.
- c. Updating of Greenway Plan: It has been almost ten years since the first Greenway Plan was assembled by Greenways Incorporated. Many of the projects included in the original plan have been installed in the Greenway but the recent project requests have demonstrated that it now is a good time to review and update the plan. This is a large item that could generate a lot of discussion so it might be a good idea to set aside an entire meeting to discuss this subject. Kim will work on assembling information about the previous plan and what has been done to date. If that information is available soon enough the February meeting can focus on updating the plan.
- **d. Greenway & Trail Users Advisory Group update:** The item on the agenda for tonight is winter events. The group will be discussing what activities are taking place and how they can help promote those activities and events.

III. Greenway Agency Updates

- a. City of East Grand Forks: EGF has applied to the Friends of the Greenway for funding for a playground in the campground but Dave has not heard back from them. Lonny will look into the application status. An application for funding was also submitted to the MN DNR for rerouting the path at LaFave Park so the lower path can be abandoned and turned over to the anglers who access the riverbank. The Council is not interested in funding the repairs if they do not receive outside funding. The City also applied for funds from the MN DNR to expand the size of the downtown boat ramp.
- **b.** City of Grand Forks: The idea of a community garden in the Greenway has surfaced again. Melanie will submit a project request form to begin the process for consideration.
- c. GF Park District: The dog park was vandalized by someone who drove a vehicle through the fence. So far there have been no arrests made in the case. The warming houses are now open Monday-Friday from 3:30 pm to 8:30 pm and 12:30 pm to 8:30 pm on weekends.
- d. MN DNR: No report

IV. Other

- a. Winter Fest: Plans are coming together for the event, scheduled for Saturday, February 13. The event starts with a pancake breakfast at the VFW in EGF and continues with the Grand Cities 100 snowmobile races, vintage snowmobile display, 5 & 10K Frozen Feat run/walk, wacky winter games, hands on activities for the kids and dog sled rides. There will be a soup tent at noon. Most events are free and open to everyone to enjoy (races require registration fees). Log on to www.grandforksgov.com/greenway for more information.
- b. Friends of the Greenway: The Friends have filed a letter with the state of Minnesota to announce their intent to dissolve the organization. They plan to give their remaining funds to the Community Foundation of GF EGF & Region. The group is in the process of writing the criteria for funding approval of applications to the Foundation for future projects.




Community Green Grand Forks, ND





Proposed Community Green Section




Proposed Rotary Park Section


